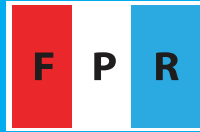

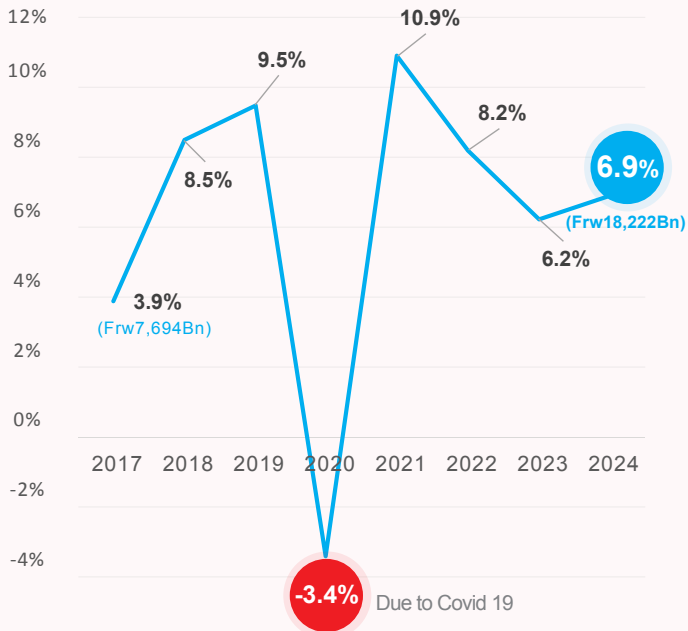

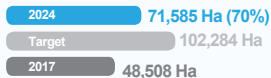

Contribution of Agriculture and Animal Resources to GDP



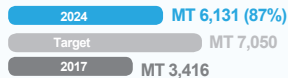
Hectares(Ha) of irrigated land



Annual Metric Tons(MT) of fertilizers



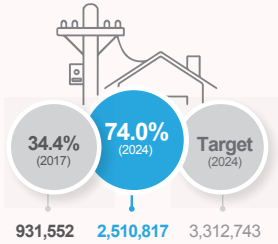
Multiplication of improved seeds in the country (Metric Tons)



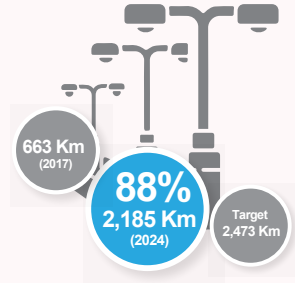

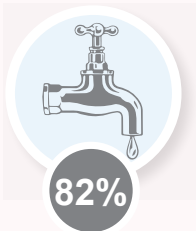

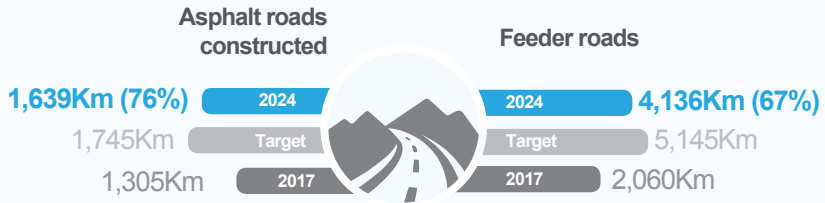


Constructed Water Treatment Plants

Airports

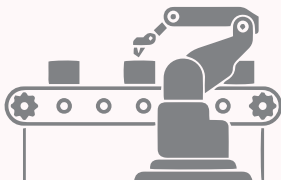
- > Kigali International Airport(KIA) was upgraded
- > Kamembe Airport was rehabilitated
- > Runways, taxiways and apron pavements were constructed at the new airport in Bugesera.

Housing and Settlement



- Masterplans were reviewed (National Land use and Development Master Plan, City of Kigali Master Plan, and District Land use Plans)
- 87 IDP Model Villages were constructed
- 14,547 households were relocated in planned settlements from 3,048 households in 2017. The target was 13,800 households.

- Chemical Manufacturing (APEX Biotech, Cooper-Pharma Africa na BioNTech)
- Mosquito nets Manufacturing
- Construction Materials Manufacturing
- Agriculture Transformation Industries and Fertilizers' Manufacturing.

Information and Communication Technology(ICT)

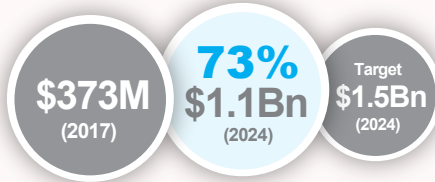
- › Internet and communication costs have been reduced
- › **Public services using ICT were increased** from 155 in 2017 to 684 in 2024. The target is to have all public services provided through use of ICT.
- › **Electronic payments** reached **99%**
- › **Internet coverage** reached **78%** from **39.7%** in 2017

Environmental Management

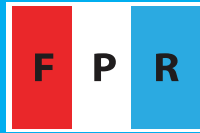


- > Forest cover of total surface area **reached 30.4% (728,945 Ha)** from 710,392 Ha in 2017
- > Public forest plantation allocated to private operators for effective management **reached 63.4% from 14.1% in 2017**

- > **Sports infrastructure was constructed or upgraded** (BKArena, Bugesera, Ngoma, Nyagatare and Huye Stadiums, Amahoro Stadium, Kigali Pele Stadium, Kigali Golf Club and others)



SOCIAL TRANSFORMATION

Education



➤ 27,412 new classrooms were constructed. Total number of classrooms now are more than 76,000



➤ TVETs have increased and are located across 392 out of 416 sectors across the country. In 2017, TVETs were in 200 sectors.



➤ Number of teachers has increased from 71,041 (2017) to 110,523 (2024)

➤ Teachers' salary has increased; and Umwarimu SAACO was strengthened

➤ School Feeding Program was scaled up across all primary, secondary and TVET schools.

Health



➤ Life expectancy has increased to 69.6 (2022) from 66.6 (2017)

➤ Model health facilities, programs and centers of excellence were established and are offering services in treating diseases that were normally requiring to travel abroad such as cancer, kidney transplant, cardiac surgery, ophthalmology, etc



➤ Hospitals were constructed: Byumba, Gatunda, Gatonde, Munini, Nyabikenke and Nyarugenge.

➤ Rehabilitations were made at Kabgayi and Kibogora Hospitals



➤ 12 new health centers were constructed

➤ Health posts have increased from 473 (2017) to 1,252 (2024)

Social Protection



> More than 480,000 households were supported with cows through Girinka program. The baseline was 297,230 whereas the target was 486,230 (2024)



> VUP was scaled up nationwide to support vulnerable groups.

> Vulnerable Genocide survivors were supported. 4,252 houses were constructed while others were rehabilitated.

> National policies on persons with disabilities and elderly persons were established.

Nutrition and Early Childhood Development

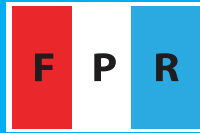


> More than 200,000 vulnerable households with pregnant and lactating women have benefited from the Direct Support.



> ECDs centers have increased from 4,109 to 31,444

> In order to fight malnutrition, since 2017, more than 42,000 metric tons of blended fortified food were distributed to more than 100,000 children and more than 40,000 lactating women; every year.



GOVERNANCE AND JUSTICE

■ National Unity



- Level of reconciliation and unity among Rwandans stands at 94.7% (2023) from 92.5% in 2017.
- Continued efforts to foster unity and resilience among Rwandans through programs such as Ndi Umunyarwanda, etc.

■ National Security and Sovereignty



- Maintained personal and property safety and security (Citizens' confidence in security organs increased to 97% from 92.6% in 2017)

■ Justice and the fight against Genocide



- Continued efforts to pursue, indict, prosecute and punish perpetrators of the Genocide against the Tutsi in 1994, fighting denial, revisionism and Genocide ideology in general. Also, efforts to preserve Genocide memorial sites and historical memory of the Genocide against the Tutsi.
- Four (4) Memorial sites of the Genocide against the Tutsi (Nyamata, Murambi, Kigali and Bisesero) have been registered to the UNESCO World Heritage Convention

Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation



➤ Rwanda's diplomatic missions abroad increased to 48 from 34 (2017) whereas foreign diplomatic missions with residence in Rwanda have increased to 45 from 29 (2017).



➤ Rwanda is at the forefront to implement the Visa-free access to different nationalities and currently more than 62 Countries globally provide Rwandans with Visa at their arrival.

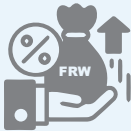

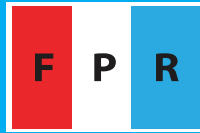

Agriculture and Animal Resources

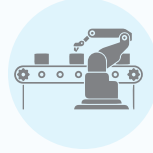


Annual Growth of Agriculture and Animal Resources

- **Continue to improve public transport services in both urban and rural areas.**

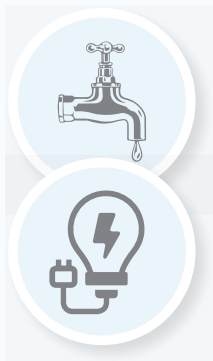


- **Construction of three ports along Lake Kivu (Rusizi, Karongi and Rutsiro)**

Electricity Access, Water Supply and Sanitation



- Households connectivity to clean water and electricity will reach 100%
- Cooking technologies will improved in a bid to protect the environment
- Sewerage systems, fecal sludge treatment plants and modern landfills will be constructed in City of Kigali, Secondary Cities and other towns.

Housing and Settlements



- Districts land use master plans will be completed and implemented.
- Settlement will be improved through provision of basic infrastructure, relocation of households from high risk zones and informal settlements.
- Affordable houses will be constructed to facilitate Rwandans to access decent housing.

Information and Communication Technology



- › Quick and reliable communication Services will reach 100%
- › ICT Infrastructure will continue to be increased.
- › Digital literacy will be increased for all Rwandans
- › Use of Artificial Intelligence(AI) will be increased.

Investment and Financial Services



- › Programs aimed at making Rwanda an Investment destination and financial hub will be implemented.
- › Rwandans will be mobilised to embrace a saving culture including facilitating youth and women to access cheap loans
- › Strategies to access green and climate finance will be put in place.

Tourism



› Tourism revenue is expected to increase from 495 M USD in 2024 to 1.1B USD in 2029

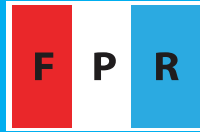


› Through use of ICT artists will be facilitated to generate revenue from their arts.

Environmental Protection

- › Annual revenue from minerals will reach USD 1.8Bn from USD 1.1 B in 2024
- › Implementation of projects aimed to protect the environment in urban areas prone to disasters will be accelerated.
- › Meteorological services will continue to be improved to provide timely meteorological information to Rwandans and other sectors.

Goal: To ensure that Rwandans are healthy, skilled and capable of contributing to the development of the nation; with a stable and safe society that considers our values and culture.

Education



➤ Teachers will be increased in numbers and capacity; education infrastructure, curricula, and other learning equipment (including ICT), will be increased.



➤ Number of classrooms will be increased at all levels; schools of excellence will be increased as well.

➤ School dropout will be tackled; and the School Feeding Program will be strengthened

➤ TVETs will be supported and strengthened

Health



➤ Health sector workforce will be increased and strengthened in number and capacity

➤ Hospitals will be constructed and rehabilitated, including Muhororo, Gisenyi, Masaka, Ruhengeri among others.



➤ Advanced health services will be strengthened; efforts to prevention and services to treat the communicable and non communicable diseases will continue as well

➤ Community Based Health Insurance (CBHI) services will be scaled up.

➤ Stunting among children will reduce from 33% to 15% by 2029

Social Protection



› The needy beneficiaries will be supported to graduate from poverty; by providing the integrated package of interventions.



› The support will be provided to needy Genocide Survivors

› The improved welfare of persons with disabilities and elderly persons, will be ensured.

Sports and Culture

› Different sports and entertainment facilities will be established and maintained.



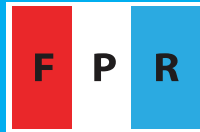
